



We hope you have enjoyed your winter Forest School activities, we have enjoyed seeing photos of your bird feeders, animal tracks and winter walks. For your final activity we would like you to go back to your special tree. 5 weeks ago we asked you to pick a special tree and observe it and the environment around it closely. You may have sketched it or taken a photograph. This week we would like you to visit your tree once again and observe closely to see how it has changed over time as we are now entering Spring. Here are photographs of the Oak tree we have been observing over time.



We observed differences in the branches. There are now clusters of brown buds waiting to grow into leaves. There is no longer snow on the ground and look at the lovely blue sky. Daffodils are growing under the tree and have buds so will flower soon. On our first visit to the tree we were wearing thermals. This week we didn't have a coat on! We are going to visit our tree again in another 5 weeks to see how it has changed. It would be great if you can keep visiting your tree too and observe how it changes throughout the seasons.

Also attached this week is an I Spy Spring Hunt. As we move into Spring, which changes can you spot? Can you find some frog spawn in a pond? Can you spot some daffodils flowering? Keep looking on your walks over the next few weeks and observe the changes. Thank you for taking part in our activities!
