The Coldstone Cut and Stump Cross Cavern Visit

On Wednesday, Class Three joined with friends from Fountains School, for an exciting visit to The Coldstone Cut and Stump Cross Caverns. The visit supported learning in science and geography as we have been investigating rocks and mountains.

The day began with a brisk walk up the hill to the Coldstone Cut Sculpture, where we saw rocks used as a material to create artwork. We then met the Coldstone Cut Quarry Manager, who explained how the quarry works and what the rock is used for. He explained that dynamite is used to blast the rock so that it can then be collected and transported away. There was great excitement when he arranged for us to have a look at an enormous lorry that had wheels taller than a man.

Having experienced being over one thousand feet above sea level, where it was very windy, we then took shelter underground at the caves at Stump Cross. We had a wonderful time exploring the caverns and observing stalactite and stalagmite formations. There were opportunities to see lots of fossils and to develop our understanding of how fossils are created. The experience of being inside a cave has inspired us with lots ideas for our story writing next week.
